

Mole Day Stuff

Greetings moles and femoles, it's time to eat, drink, and merry-make. Mole Day, the most glorious day of celebration known throughout the free world, is coming soon to Dunlap. The National Mole Day Foundation (<http://www.moleday.org/>) has designated the 2015 Mole Day theme as "May the MOLES Be With You." The information below should be used as a guide in constructing your Mole Day projects and preparing for the Mole Day celebration. Your project should fit into one of the five described areas and should relate to the theme.

1. Mole Day Posters

- All posters should be really neat to look at, touch, or smell. Posters will be graded on originality, adherence to the theme, and just how impressive the judges deem them to be.

2. Mole Day Hats, Shirts, and other Appropriate Apparel

All items should promote Mole Day fun and the 2015 theme. The more bizarre, the better. Just be sure to celebrate Mole Day and the wonderful world of chemistry.

3. Aluminum (foil) Moles

Using 1 mole of student provided aluminum foil (that would be between 6 and 7 feet of aluminum foil), form a mole (the furry kind). Your mole may be made of aluminum foil only. The use of tape, staples, glue, toothpicks, or even small winged nymphs is strictly prohibited. (It is prohibited by the same law that covers mattress tags.)

4. Mole Day Pies, Cakes, and Cookies

This is your chance to show off your culinary skills, provide for the festivities, and celebrate Mole Day. Make a big, tasty pie that celebrates Mole Day and/or the theme, May the Moles Be With You. What? The only pie you know how to make involves Spam®, White Castle Sliders®, pork rinds, etc.? No problem! Submit it for judging by the firm of "Ferric Gastric Sac."

Food items are due on Wednesday, October 21, 2015 at 8:13 a.m. in room N6. Notice of intended item must be submitted in writing by 8:13 a.m. on Monday, October 19, 2015.

5. Open Category

The category consists of costumes, games, songs, poems, stories, full-length movies, etc. that will increase the pleasure of the Mole Day festivities for all persons directly involved. Songs should be recorded so that we might listen to them on Mole Day or, if you prefer, performed live in front of an unruly crowd. Please, please, I beseech thee. Do not plagiarize Mole jokes, pictures, and the like from the NMDF website or other Mole Day sources. Be creative!

The contest is not required but is an extra credit option for the second grading period. Points will be added at the end of the second grading period. Winners of each category competition will receive bonus points. Confused? Great! Get started on those projects!

All entries must be received in Room N6 by 8:13 A.M. on Monday, October 19, 2015.

All decisions of the judges will be final.
